Volunteer Guide

To keep events fun and safe, volunteers must comply with Alcohol Beverage Control regulations and other rules, which are enforced with zero tolerance. Failure to comply may result in legal consequences or volunteer dismissal.

- No one can take an alcoholic beverage without the exchange of cash or an ADA token. Only one drink per person is allowed.
- Anyone wishing to consume alcohol must have the proper wristband. If you question the age of someone with a wristband, ask to see ID again.
 - Do not serve individuals who appear to be intoxicated (belligerent, slurring, poor coordination, etc.).
 - No one may consume alcohol before shifts or while working or appearing to work. Nametags signify that volunteers are on shift. Nametags must be removed from anyone consuming alcohol after a shift (and preferably, ADA shirt will be turned inside out).
- Volunteers serving alcohol must take the RASP (Responsible Alcohol Seller Program) test and submit a certificate to ADA.
- It's illegal for anyone under 21 to purchase or possess alcohol. It's illegal for anyone to aid in the unlawful sale, purchase or possession of alcohol or to fraudulently use ID to obtain alcohol.
 - Alcohol Law Enforcement agents attend ADA events to ensure compliance. If you feel unsure of rules or uncomfortable handling any issue, seek a supervisor's help.

Volunteer Perks!

1-2 shifts: Event t-shirt

3-4 shifts: Event t-shirt + one appreciation party invite

5+ shifts: Event t-shirt + two appreciation party invites

5+ shifts, including at least one late shift: Event t-shirt + two VIP appreciation party invites

Volunteers also receive beverage tokens to use after shifts.
